## **Course description**

The Service Learning/Civic Engagement component of Morningside College's General Education Programme gives students the opportunity to engage in substantive service work. The goal of the course is to allow students to apply in practical settings for the benefit of others some of what they are learning in the classroom, and to help them discover how they can make their own positive impact on the world. The course also inspires students to explore perennial questions of human existence and human values.

## **Learning outcomes**

At the completion of the Service Learning Project students will be prepared to:

- recognize pressing societal issues in Hong Kong and the wider world;
- assess the resources available and determine what is important to communities in need;
- evaluate a range of possible methods and responses;
- combine prior classroom knowledge with experiences/observations in the field to make decisions and solve problems;
- · understand root issues underlying community needs; and
- consider service not as a one-off experience, but as a lifetime commitment.

# Requirements

- All forms available from General Education Office, e-mail: <a href="mailto:gemc@cuhk.edu.hk">gemc@cuhk.edu.hk</a>, or on the College website: www.morningside.cuhk.edu.hk.
- 1. Submit the "GEMC3001 Service Project Proposal" form for approval <u>before</u> registering for GEMC3001. (For students completing formal internships with NGOs and/or non-college individualized service learning projects only.)
- 2. Engage in a service project for a **minimum** of 40 hours and keep a journal in which you record and analyze your service experiences. Options for completing the project include:
  - formal internship with a non-governmental organization (NGO)
  - participation in a programme developed by the College or other units of the University
  - individualized service project (in Hong Kong or elsewhere)
- 3. Ensure that your supervisor submits his/her signed evaluation **directly** to the General Education Office via e-mail, fax, or post.
- 4. Submit (a) your service journal (Write immediately and frequently!); (b) a properly referenced essay that examines the service learning project and engages the readings listed in your proposal; and (c) a project poster by the end-of-term deadlines. All assignments and a Veriguide declaration for the essay must be submitted by the deadlines to <a href="mailto:gemc@cuhk.edu.hk">gemc@cuhk.edu.hk</a>. Late work will be subject to a penalty.
