Important Notes

(Please read carefully before application.)

1. Exchange Period

- a. Ideally, undergraduate students with have good academic and good disciplinary record at CUHK, should go during their second and third year of undergraduate study.
- b. According to the <u>Regulations Governing Full-time Undergraduate Studies</u>, CUHK students who have satisfied all graduation requirements shall graduate (Regulation 12.1). **Students are strongly recommended to plan in advance for their academic studies so as to go on <u>exchange before earning all credit units required for CUHK graduation.</u>**
- c. Students should refer to the CUHK Undergraduate Student Handbook to check the credit unit requirements of their enrolled CUHK undergraduate programme and other requirements for graduation, decide how many course units they plan to enroll in each academic term and apply to go on exchange BEFORE earning all credit units required for graduation.
- d. Students who <u>intend to go on exchange after their expected graduation date</u> can only apply and participate in an exchange programme for one academic term which takes place <u>immediately after</u> their last active academic term for taking courses for graduation (excludes summer term) at CUHK. In the selection exercises, students concerned
 - can only apply for exchange for one academic term (except for students with an **expected** graduation date on 31 December 2024 who are <u>not</u> eligible for any exchange programme in 2025-26), and
 - will be given an **exchange nomination offer (if applicable) only if they have/would <u>not</u> earned all credit units required for graduation (i.e. have outstanding credit units shown on CUSIS) by the time of placement allocation is done.**

2. Maximum Cumulative Period of Exchange

Throughout the study period at CUHK, each student can go on exchange for a maximum of one academic year, i.e. exchange(s) in two regular academic terms offered by any CUHK unit(s) plus one university-wide summer exchange offered by the Office of Academic Links (OAL).

3. Course Load Requirement during Exchange (For Undergraduates)

- a. Students must enroll in a <u>minimum of nine (9) units and obtain passing grades in at least six (6) units of courses per term (or equivalent)</u>, except for summer term. Failure to do so may cause complications to graduation and/or 100% repayment of financial support provided through OAL and/or the College.
- b. Students are highly recommended to seek pre-approval from major and/or relevant CUHK department/programmes on the transferability of credit units from host institutions to their studies at CUHK prior to their application, especially for students intended to meet the graduation requirements with the transferred credit units. Final approval for courses and unit exemption will only be given after the official transcript is received from the host institution with acceptable grade(s) for the course(s) concerned.
- c. Students planning to go on <u>exchange in their final academic term</u> should note and take into consideration that their graduation may possibly be affected should the official transcript not reaching RES by the specific deadline for record and seeking approval for course and unit exemption (if applicable) to meet the degree conferment date. Actual deadlines will be released by RES in due course. An official transcript is an essential document for course and unit exemption. In general, it takes at least two months for the host institution to issue the official transcripts after

the exchange programme ends.

4. Credit Transfer

Students are advised to approach relevant CUHK academic departments which have full autonomy to determine which credits of courses taken abroad could be transferred to CUHK.

Students are strongly encouraged to visit the host institution website, gather relevant courses information and discuss with their academic advisor on their study plan as early as feasible. Please <u>finalize the choice of programmes prior to the exchange application</u>.

5. English Language Proficiency

- a. Programmes marked with # in the <u>'Exchange Programme Details' table</u> mean TOEFL or IELTS scores is mandatory.
- b. Students must meet the respective English proficiency requirements with a TOEFL or IELTS overall score and sub-scores from one test attempt that took place on or after 1 September 2023. Otherwise, students will NOT be considered as an eligible applicant for the exchange programmes.
- c. TOEFL MyBest Scores and the result from IELTS One Skill Retake are <u>not</u> acceptable.
- d. If the TOEFL/IELTS score report (if any) is no longer valid, students are still required to submit the report for the exchange application for reference purpose. If needed, please arrange to retake the TOEFL or IELTS test to fulfil the host institution requirements. In view of the limited available timeslots for IELTS or TOEFL tests, students should schedule to take/re-take a test as soon as possible.
- e. <u>Some host institutions set the valid period of TOEFL/IELTS scores at 24 months prior to the commencement of exchange period.</u> It is students' responsibility to ensure their TOEFL/IELTS scores meet the requirements set by the host institution and sit for a TOEFL or IELTS test again for meeting their host institution's requirement if needed.
- f. For students who wish to go to <u>United Kingdom</u> to exchange, they are recommended to sit for IELTS (UKVI Academic) test to fulfill UK (Tier 4) student visa requirement. Further information on the approved test can be referred to the <u>British Council Hong Kong website</u> and the <u>UK Visas</u> and <u>Immigration website</u>.
- g. When submitting the <u>TOEFL/IELTS</u> score report, please ensure that the candidate full name, test date and scores are clearly shown.
- h. For programmes with TOEFL or IELTS requirements but without #, students will be required to provide a valid TOEFL or IELTS score when they submit their application to the host institution after being nominated.

6. Other Language Proficiencies

For those who would like to select an exchange programme that requires proficiency in other languages, they must indicate in the online application form that they have a proficiency level no less than one level lower than the specified requirement (e.g. if the requirement is German – Intermediate, you must indicate that you have at least the proficiency of elementary German). Otherwise, application for that particular exchange programme will not be considered.

For more information about European languages, please refer to the <u>Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR)</u>.

7. Financing Your Exchange

The fees for a typical exchange programme include CUHK tuition, CUHK and College Student Union fees (for undergraduate students only), accommodation (CUHK, host university or private rental depending on the programme structure), health and travel insurance, meal plan, student visa, books and stationery, personal expenses, cultural activities, transportation, warm clothing (for some destinations), and airfare.

Students may apply for financial support under CUHK Student Exchange Financial Aid and Scholarship Scheme (FASS) and EDB Subsidy Schemes. For details, please visit OAL website at https://www.oal.cuhk.edu.hk/scholarshipsandfinancialaid.

The College also has Travel Grants made available to students who face financial difficulties to apply. For details, please refer to the College's weekly notices in late January and/or take reference of last year's weekly notices to plan ahead.

8. Application and Placement Result

Applicants are required to complete the online application form by the application deadline on 20 February 2025, and attend an interview scheduled for end February or early March 2025.

Exchange nomination results (both OAL and College) will be released in mid-March 2025.

If students receive more than one exchange nomination offer. Students <u>can only accept one offer</u> either from OAL, College or other Unit of CUHK.

For accepting College Exchange Programme, nominees are required to submit acceptance documents (i.e. Acceptance Form, Family Support Form and a deposit) by the mentioned deadline. They are then required to send their exchange application to the host institution. The application period of the host institution varies from February to May for Term 1 and Full Year exchange, and from May to October for Term 2 exchange.

Please note that the final decision on the acceptance of exchange application rests with the host university.
